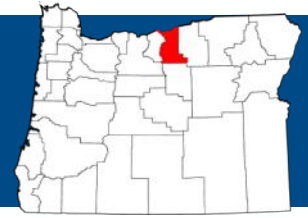


Justice Reinvestment in Gilliam County



Gilliam County received a Justice Reinvestment Grant in the amount of \$100,000 for 2017-2019 to support the following priorities:



SAFETY People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.



ACCOUNTABILITY People receive transitional support when re-entering the community from prison including treatment and appropriate sanctions.



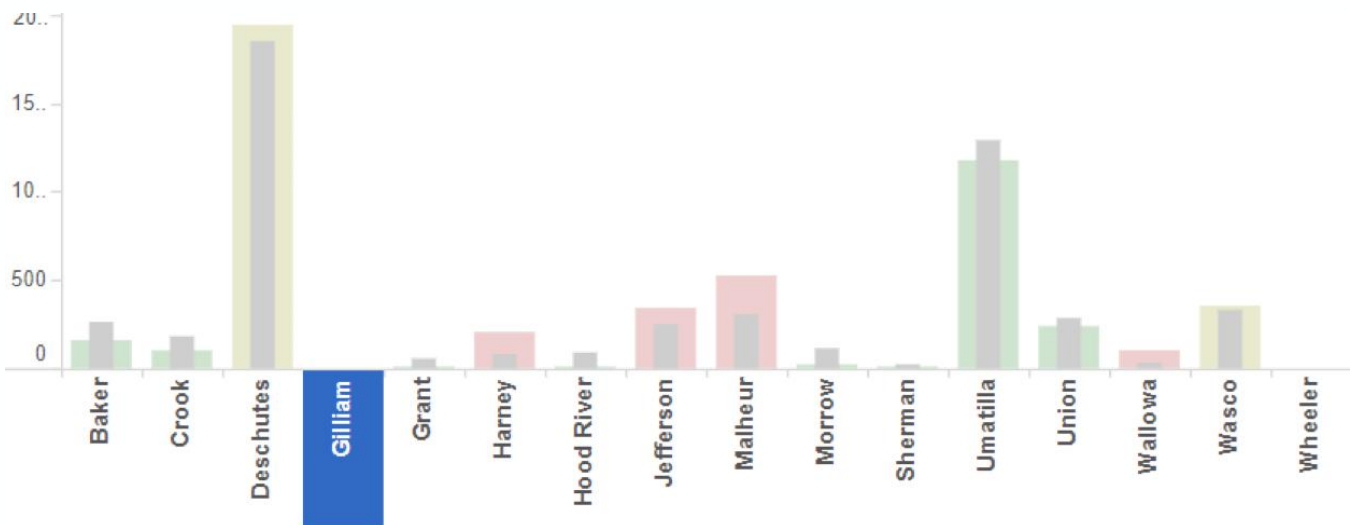
TREATMENT Funds are used for addiction treatment and cognitive behavioral treatment.



VICTIM SERVICES Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of crime through community based assistance.

- County's baseline (average) from July 2012 - June 2015
- Reduced prison usage
- Increased prison usage by <10%
- Increased prison usage by $\geq 10\%$

POPULATION MATTERS

In less populated counties, small shifts in prison usage appear exaggerated when reflected as percent changes from baseline.
