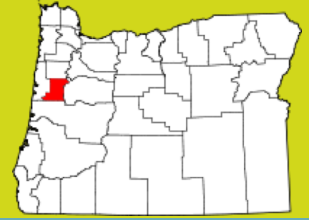


Justice Reinvestment in Benton County



Benton County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$514,205** for 2017-2019 to support the following:



SAFETY People undergo thorough risk assessments.



ACCOUNTABILITY People receive enhanced supervision based on Thinking for Change.



TREATMENT People will be prepared to be treatment-ready prior to being referred to substance abuse treatment. Funds support Benton County's Drug Court.



VICTIM SERVICES Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.



HOUSING Increased transitional housing options offer people opportunities to maintain supervision compliance.

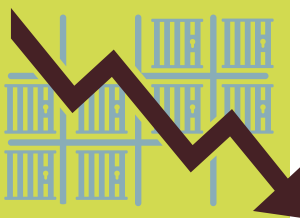
How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
