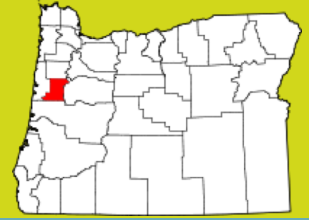


# Justice Reinvestment in Benton County



Benton County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$514,205** for 2017-2019 to support the following:



**SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk assessments.



**ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive enhanced supervision based on Thinking for Change.



**TREATMENT** People will be prepared to be treatment-ready prior to being referred to substance abuse treatment. Funds support Benton County's Drug Court.



**VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.



**HOUSING** Increased transitional housing options offer people opportunities to maintain supervision compliance.

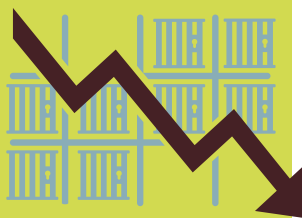
## How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
