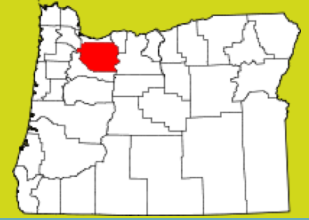






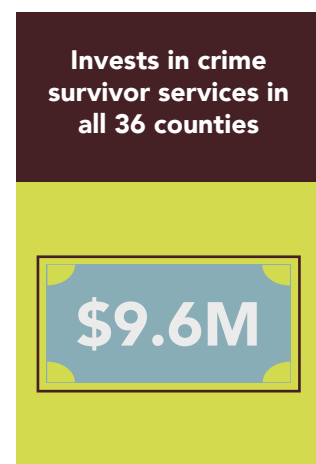
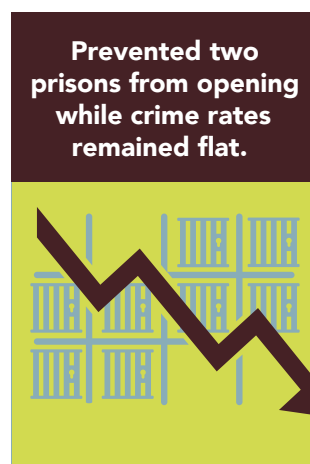
Justice Reinvestment in Clackamas County



Clackamas County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$2.41 million** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive reentry type services through a Transition Center that offers education, employment, mentoring, and other services.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive intensive residential and community-based substance abuse treatment and mental health services in the community.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse.

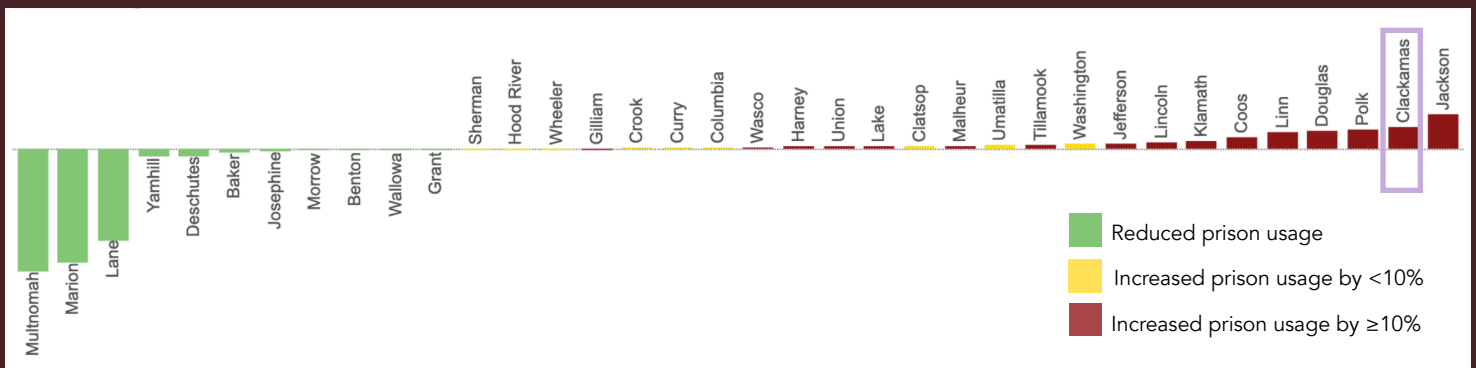
