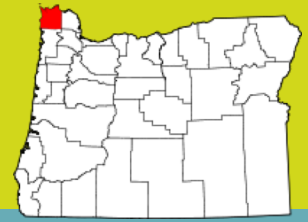






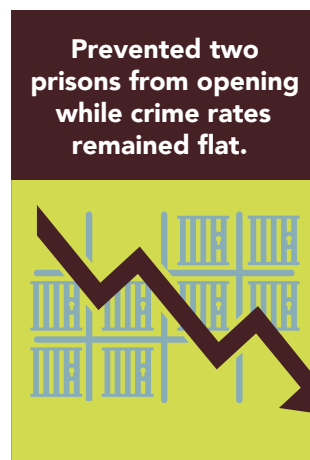
Justice Reinvestment in Clatsop County



Clatsop County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$486,302** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People receive thorough risk assessments and evidence-based model programs to reduce recidivism.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive enhanced supervision, case management, and restitution monitoring..
-  **TREATMENT** Funds are used for additional treatment, cognitive behavior treatment, stable housing, employment referral services, and parenting classes.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse.

What Elected Officials Can Do

Justice Reinvestment is an important shift in how Oregon creates greater public safety. It's the smart approach, but it will take time, commitment, and leadership to get right.

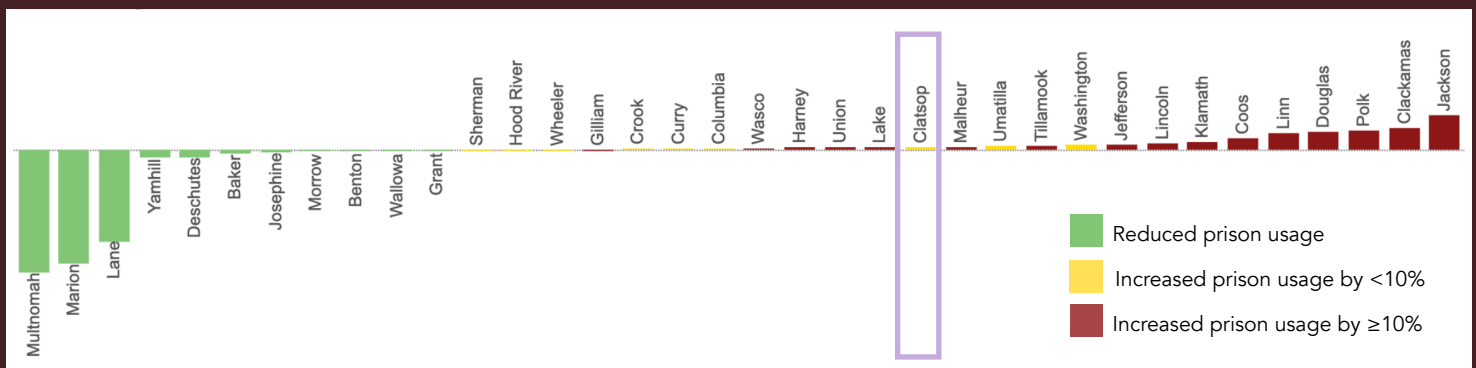
