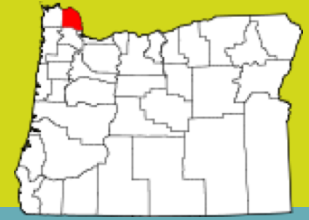






# Justice Reinvestment in Columbia County



Columbia County received Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$554,066** and **\$702,556** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People receive evidence-based tools and risk assessments to reduce recidivism.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive enhanced supervision and case management and restitution monitoring.
-  **TREATMENT** Funds are used for addiction treatment, cognitive behavior treatment, housing, employment and referral services, and parenting classes.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse.


## How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
