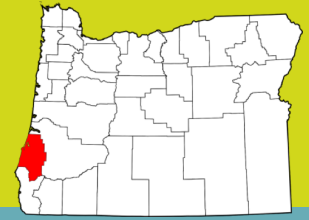






Justice Reinvestment in Coos County



Coos County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$789,245** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive intensive community supervision.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic violence.


How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
