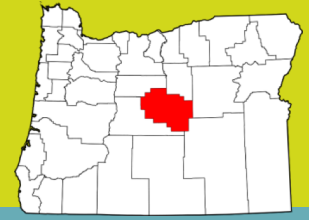






Justice Reinvestment in Crook County



Crook County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$298,956** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive transitional support when re-entering the community from prison incl. housing, treatment, and appropriate sanctions.
-  **TREATMENT** Funds are used for cognitive behavioral treatment and employment services.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of child abuse.

Justice Reinvestment is an important shift in how Oregon creates greater public safety. It's the smart approach, but it will take time, commitment, and leadership to get right.

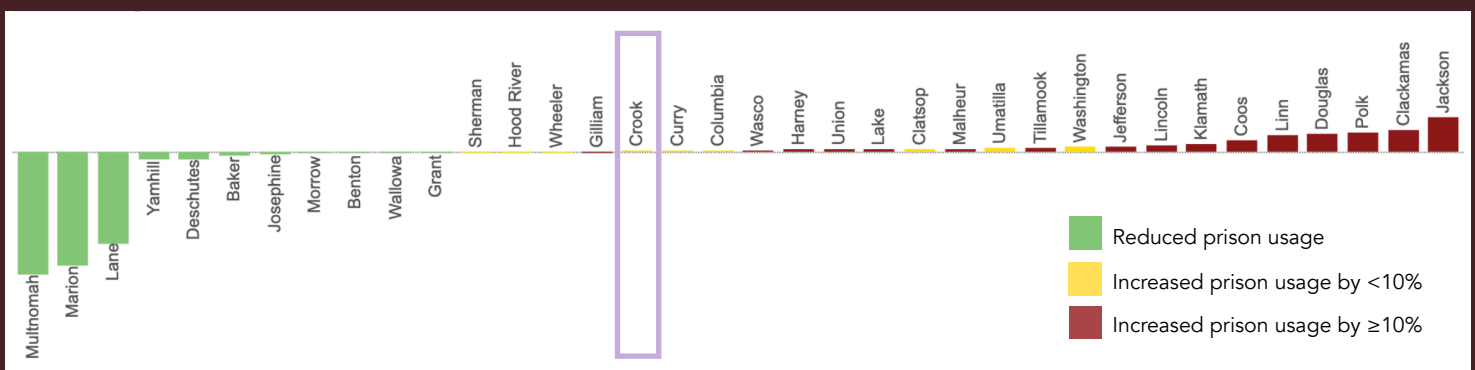
