**SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.



**ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive intensive community supervision supported by Thinking for a Change program concepts.




**TREATMENT** People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment and mental health services.




**VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support adult and child victims of domestic and sexual assault.
