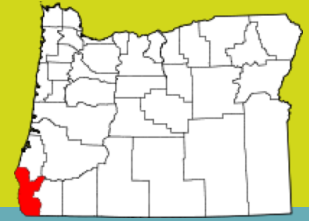






Justice Reinvestment in Curry County



Curry County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$215,249** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive intensive community supervision supported by Thinking for a Change program concepts.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment and mental health services.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support adult and child victims of domestic and sexual assault.

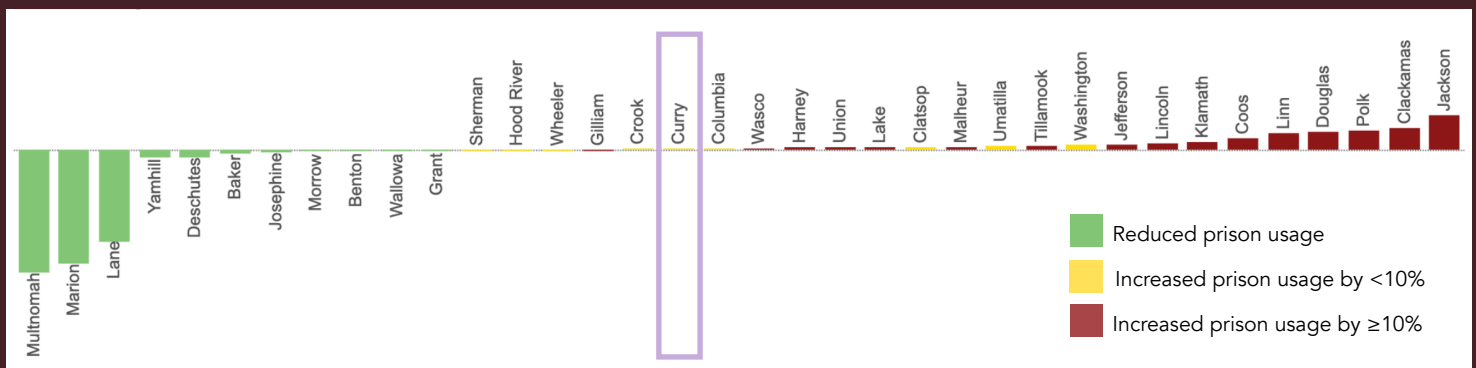
