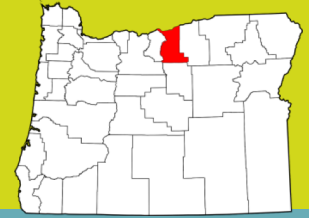






Justice Reinvestment in Gilliam County



Gilliam County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$100,000** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive transitional support when re-entering the community from prison including treatment and appropriate sanctions.
-  **TREATMENT** Funds are used for addiction treatment and cognitive behavioral treatment.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of crime through community-based assistance.

Justice Reinvestment is an important shift in how Oregon creates greater public safety. It's the smart approach, but it will take time, commitment, and leadership to get right.

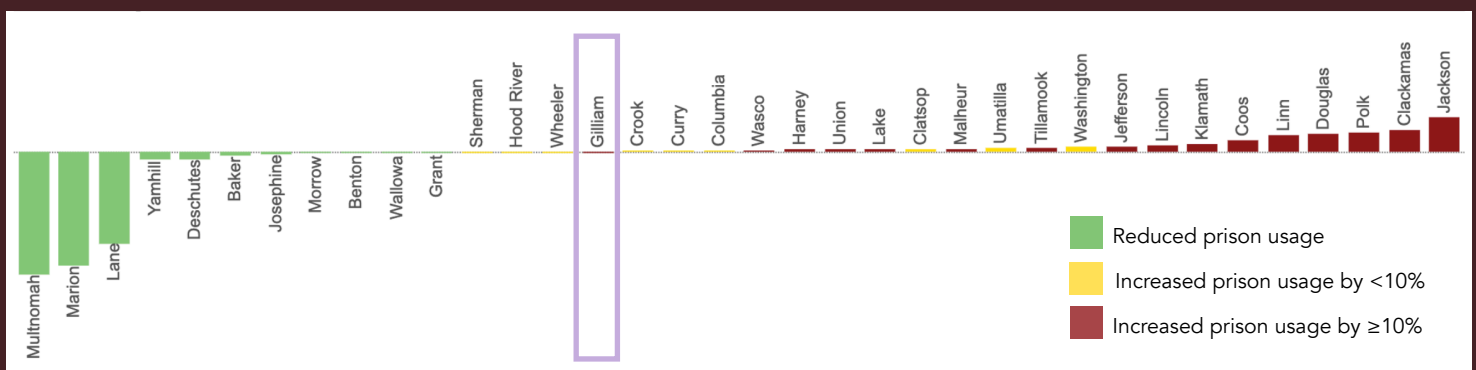
