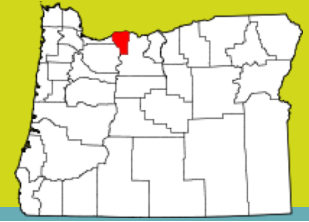






Justice Reinvestment in Hood River County



Hood River County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$155,457** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive transitional support when re-entering the community from prison incl. housing, treatment, and appropriate sanctions.
-  **TREATMENT** Funds are used for addiction treatment, cognitive behavioral treatment, stable housing, employment referral services, and parenting classes.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse.


How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
