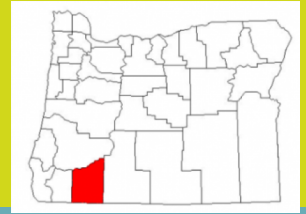






Justice Reinvestment in Jackson County



Jackson County received two Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$2.24 million** and **\$427,000** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough assessments to ensure informed release decisions and appropriate community supervision.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive intensive community supervision.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic violence.
