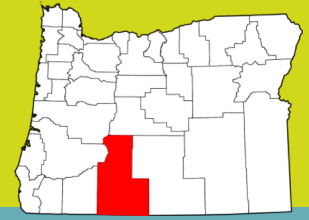






# Justice Reinvestment in Klamath County



Klamath County received a Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$1.23 million** and **\$292,868** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough assessments to ensure informed release decisions and tailor conditions of supervision and services to the individual.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive intensive community supervision. Funds increase the sanction capacity of the Klamath County jail.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment in the Klamath County jail.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.


## How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
