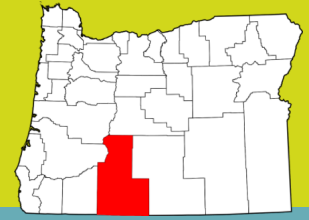


Justice Reinvestment in Klamath County



Klamath County received a Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$1.23 million** and **\$292,868** for 2017-2019 to support the following:



SAFETY People undergo thorough assessments to ensure informed release decisions and tailor conditions of supervision and services to the individual.



ACCOUNTABILITY People receive intensive community supervision. Funds increase the sanction capacity of the Klamath County jail.



TREATMENT People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment in the Klamath County jail.



VICTIM SERVICES Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.

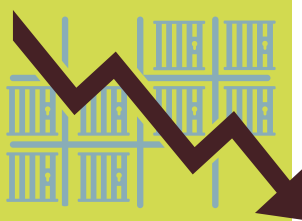
How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?

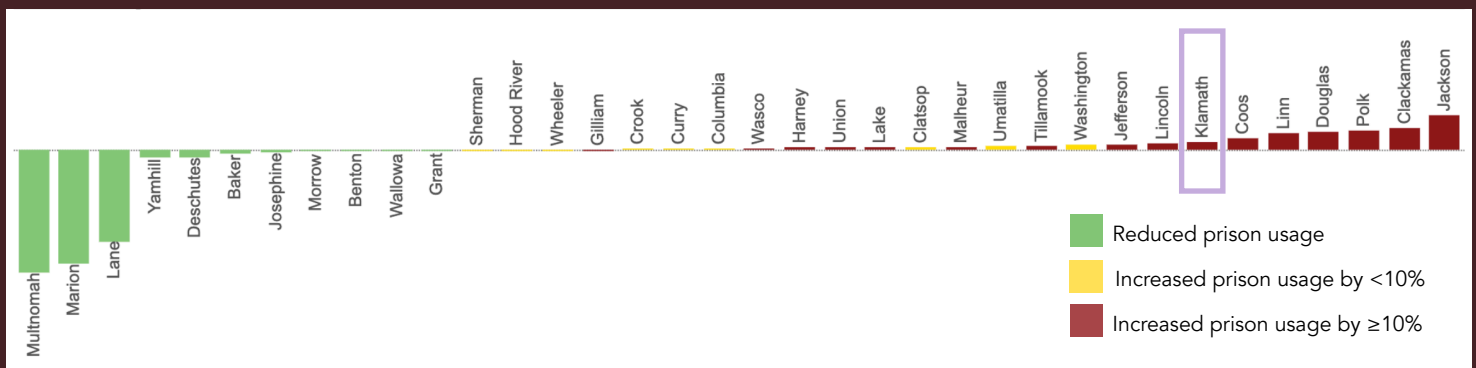
