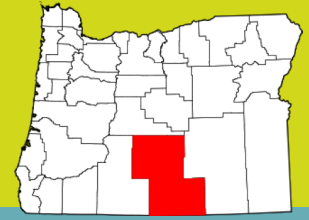






Justice Reinvestment in Lake County



Lake County received two Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$171,402** and **\$233,333** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough assessments to ensure informed and appropriate community supervision.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive intensive community supervision.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive evidence-based substance abuse treatment.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic violence.


How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
