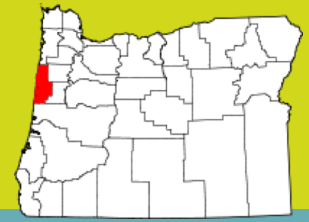






Justice Reinvestment in Lincoln County



Lincoln County received two Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$581,969** and **\$516,578** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** Funds are used to support evidence-based and data-driven practices to reduce recidivism.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive enhanced supervision and case management.
-  **TREATMENT** Funds are used for mental health treatment, housing, and transportation services.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse.

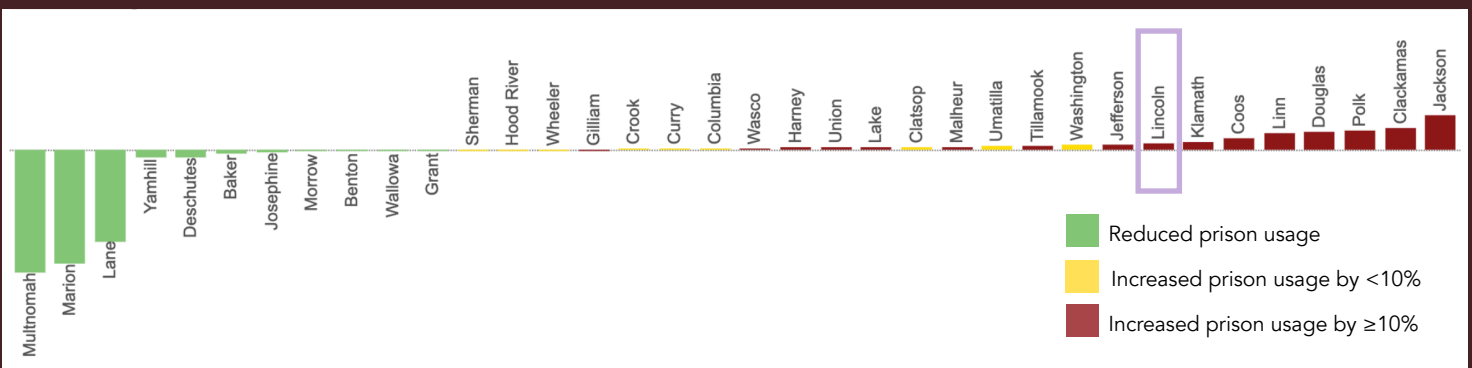
