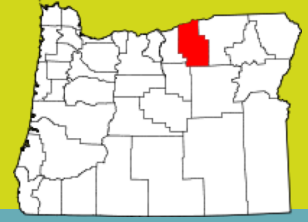





Justice Reinvestment in Morrow County



Morrow County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$139,513** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive appropriate sanctions.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.


How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?

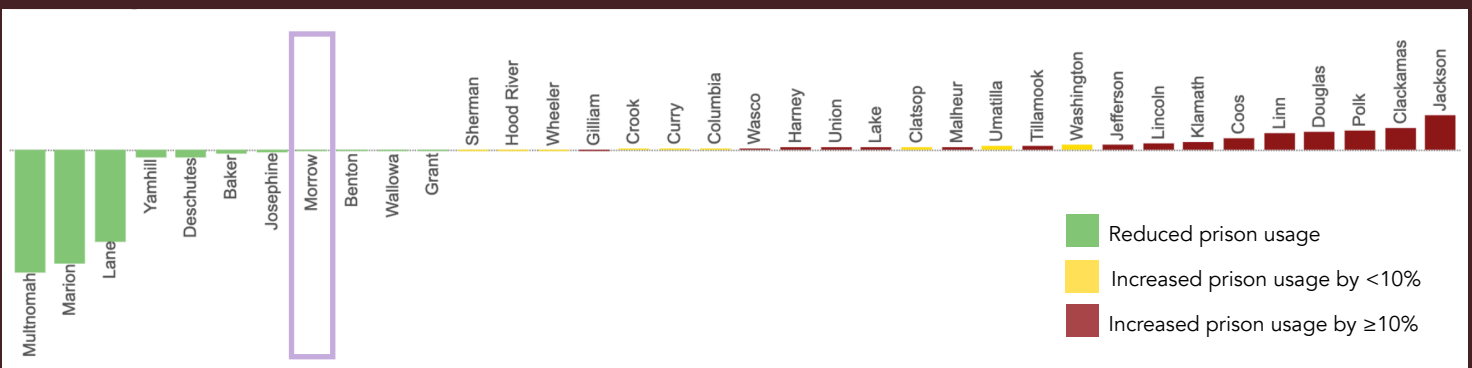
