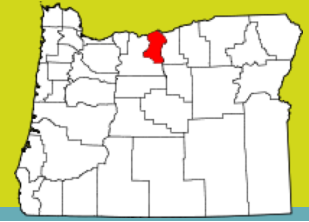


# Justice Reinvestment in Sherman County



Sherman County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$100,000** for 2017-2019 to support the following:



**SAFETY** People receive enhanced supervision.



**ACCOUNTABILITY** Funds are used for addiction treatment, employment referral services, and parenting classes.



**VICTIM SERVICES** Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.

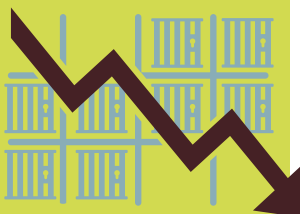
## How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?

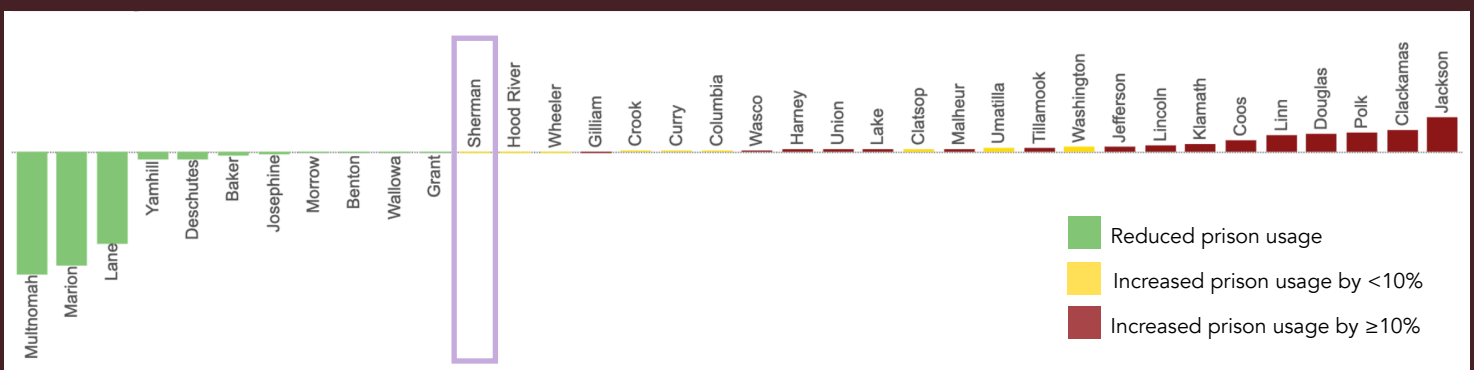
