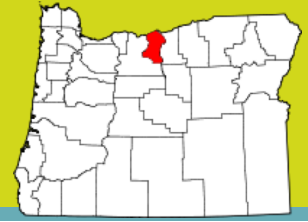


Justice Reinvestment in Sherman County



Sherman County received a Justice Reinvestment grant in the amount of **\$100,000** for 2017-2019 to support the following:



SAFETY People receive enhanced supervision.



ACCOUNTABILITY Funds are used for addiction treatment, employment referral services, and parenting classes.



VICTIM SERVICES Ten percent of the county's Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic and sexual violence.

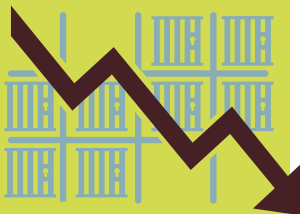
How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
