Since 2013, Oregon has consistently supported public safety policies that flatline corrections growth, invest in communities, expand survivor services, and are in line with our values:

- Safely reduce prison use

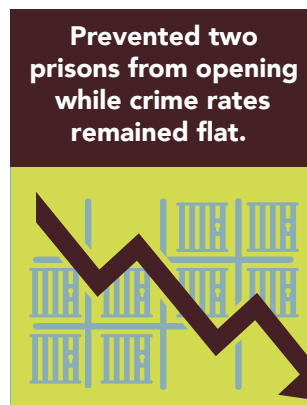
For Oregon's 2019-21 biennium, all 36 counties were invited to apply for funding to support programs that reduce recidivism and decrease prison use while ensuring accountability and public safety.

Most counties are on track to succeed in achieving these goals. Those that were not received provisional, one-year grants.

For 2019-2020, Tillamook County received a provisional grant of \$152,580 for:



VICTIM SERVICES for crime survivors, including domestic and sexual violence and for children who have been abused or neglected.
