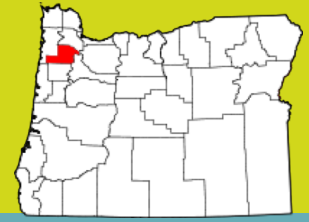






Justice Reinvestment in Yamhill County



Yamhill County received two Justice Reinvestment grants in the amount of **\$944,702** and **\$293,444** for 2017-2019 to support the following:

-  **SAFETY** People undergo thorough risk and needs assessments to determine whether they can be managed safely and effectively in the community.
-  **ACCOUNTABILITY** People receive enhanced supervision.
-  **TREATMENT** People receive intensive residential and community-based substance abuse treatment and mental health services in the community.
-  **VICTIM SERVICES** At least ten percent of Justice Reinvestment funds are used to support victims of domestic violence and child abuse.


How has Justice Reinvestment improved Oregon's approach to public safety?
